Pontefract Civic Society is proud to announce that Cartners No. 5's new bar on Shoemarket scoped 1st place in this year's Christmas display competition judged by 13 pupils from six primary schools.

Paul Cartwright, civic society Chair said "We were delighted by this year's response with over 50 decorated businesses, which was understandably slightly down on last year, though the quality of around 20% of those judged wase impressive in the eyes of the pupils. We know all the displays have brightened up the town, which encourages customers and families to explore, and enjoy the Christmas spirit"

Paul went on to say, "we've seen the enthusiasm building for window dressing during and after the pandemic, with things like the Liquorice Festival and Halloween, so this year, we provided the pupils with a little more guidance to look for what really wowed them from first impressions, and single points separated the top seven businesses".

A surprise 2nd place went to the **Indoor Market Hall**, which was a mix of numerous inflatables, wrapped parcels, garlands, and a focal stall with a memory tree supporting the Prince of Wales Hospice, plus individual stalls had decorations.

Last year's winner, **Nail Express** on Finkle Street was closely beaten into a worthy 3rd place this year.

Others which sparkled in the eyes of school pupils were Forever After, The Mad Ox, Jackie's Florist, Beastfair Vaults, and The Tea Shop on Shoemarket.

Sarah Webster, Carleton Park J&I Officer Manager, said, "The year 2 pupils from the School Council had a wonderful time".

Richard Grace, St. Giles C. E. Headteacher, said, "It's such a great opportunity for our children to participate in the judging alongside other schools in Pontefract. It's such lovely festive activity, which is always well organised by the Pontefract Civic Society and we look forward to working with them more in the new year".

COMMITTEE REPORTS HERITAGE GROUP

HERITAGE OPEN DAYS FESTIVAL SUCCESS IN CHALLENGING TIMES

The planned doubling in size of Heritage Open Days in and around Pontefract was slightly curtailed, though the remainder was a tremendous success for Pontefract Civic Society, our partners and the many visitors.

Talks and tours took place and buildings opened their doors in Pontefract, Carleton, Darrington, Ackworth, Knottingley, Ferrybridge and Brotherton.

We planned for 50 events and activities, 27 of which were brand new, and we actually delivered 45 of these aided by 27 partner organisations and individuals; under the circumstances that's pretty remarkable.

Some events were fully booked soon after release and others soon followed, namely Pontefract Park through the Ages, Imagine Pontefract 200 years Ago, Masonic Hall, Darrington Farming Walk, Past Retail & Social Gillygate, Pluto: Planet or not? (Rosse Observatory), as were many of the events at Pontefract Castle.

We were really pleased with the positive response from all of our partners, including nine new partners to the festival,



and from the general public who were both enthusiastic and really interested in Pontefract's rich heritage.

Visitors from across Wakefield district and far beyond really enjoyed the variety in our extensive programme, and I was pleased to see some faces at multiple events, which must suggest that we've got it

ST JOHN AMBULANCE WAR DEAD HONOURED

Whilst this article is in the Heritage Report, it was a true collaboration of a number of members supported by Rebecca at Pontefract Library, with the team ably being led by our vice chair and former St John Ambulance officer, Phil Cook.

Following three months of extensive preparation and research led jointly by Pontefract Civic Society and Pontefract Library, a memorial to St John Ambulance members lost in both world wars has been saved, conserved, and moved into public view, and it will be unveiled in Pontefract Town Hall on Fri 11th November by His Right Worshipful, The Mayor of Wakefield District, Cllr David Jones.



Phil Cook, civic society vice chair and a former St John officer "as the unit moved out of its Newgate HQ, it was important to save the memorial with the support of Wakefield Council. It's been a really interesting past three months of intensive

research on both the individuals named on the memorial, and the impact that the St John Ambulance organisation had on Pontefract and the surrounding villages in





supporting the war effort, including helping injured service personnel". The invitation only memorial ceremony will include current

and past St John members, civic leaders, and family members of those named. Canon June Lawson will say prayers, and the researched history will also be available on the day, and afterwards for those who can't attend.



Dwain Longley, Regional President in the North East, said:



"We are very grateful to Pontefract Civic Society for their work to have our St John memorial plaque mounted in the Town Hall where it will be on permanent display. Our volunteers worked tirelessly in a number of ways, both in England and overseas, to provide assistance during the First and Second World Wars, and this is a very fitting way to commemorate their actions many decades ago."

COMMUNITY GROUP NEWS PONTEFRACT IN BLOOM




on 19th July, the hottest day of the year, but they were impressed and awarded Pontefract Gold in the large town category.

The visit finished at the Castle to inspect the herb garden which is maintained by Castle volunteers. Despite the long, hot drought the displays were well maintained and certainly impressed Yorkshire in Bloom. Pontefract in Bloom is determined to do as well in 2023, but the credit for the Gold Award is shared with Friends of Pontefract Park, Friends of Friarwood Valley Gardens, St Giles' Church, the Castle volunteers, and Wakefield Council, including the Park Rangers.





FRIENDS OF FRIARWOOD VALLEY GARDENS

Another successful year for Friends of Friarwood Valley Gardens.

A thermoplastic play trail was completed in May, and in July several tree sculptures were carved, including

a friar at the Friarwood Lane entrance.

Four new trees were planted, to replace trees that had died and had been used for the carvings. During the summer the group was fortunate to have the help of the young people of the National Citizen Service on three occasions, performing a variety of voluntary work in the Gardens. The NCS also contributed several hundred pounds to our funds from their

fund-raising efforts.

The last event was the Lantern Festival organised by the Lions Club and was as popular as ever. The last event of the year was The Christmas Trail, on Saturday 10th December, which was very well supported.



FRIENDS OF PONTEFRACT PARK

The litter picking group has continued to meet every Wednesday at 10am throughout the year, and a litter picking station has been set up in the foyer of Aspire for park visitors to litter pick at other times.

Litter picking equipment is also available for group picks by arrangement. The Peter's Lost Peregrine booklet to accompany the trail around the Park is now on sale in Aspire. There was a launch event during the autumn half term.

Friends of the Park facilitated the provision of a bench and outdoor gym station in memory of Ken Bingley, a stalwart of Pontefract parkrun. The highlight of the year was Picnic in the Park in August, which was blessed with good weather and was a great success.

The group is now looking forward to the children's playground renovation which is due to be completed by



spring 2023, and the repair of the crumbling lakeside later in the year. Friends of Pontefract Park have also fed into the Pontefract Park Plan which will be published soon.


